## Judicial Pronouncements

### **Tehseen s. Poonawalla v. Union of India (2018) sc**

The Supreme court declared mob lynching a “horrendous act of mobocracy” that violates the rule of law and constitutional rights. The court mandated preventive, punitive and remedial measures including fast-track trials within six months, mandatory FIR registration and victim compensation schemes. The court stated that no individual or group can take the law into their own hands or act as a “lynch mob”. State government must identify districts prone to mob violence, appoint nodal officers, and proactively act against hate speech. Automatic registration of FIRs under section 153 IPC (Promoting enmity) against those who incite violence or spread fake news.

### **Dadri Lynching Case**

On September 28, 2015 a mob in Dadri (Village Bishara) Uttar Pradesh, beat 52 Years old Mohammad Akhlaq to death are injured his son on rumors that he was carrying case began in a fast-track court in 2026.

### **Darshan Singh and Ors v. State of Rajasthan (2024) Raj.**

The court highlighted that the FIR against the deceased for rape cannot be used as a “shield” by the accused to justify their actions. The bail was denied due to the gravity of the offenses.

### **Palghar Mob Lynching Case (2020-2025)**

This case involves the brutal killing of two sadhus and their driver by a mob in Palghar during the covid-19 lock down in April 2020, The Palghar case is still under investigation by the CBI.
