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

Foreign Policy Is A Reflection Of Domestic Policy

Thomas freedman argued in the other Arab spring Syria in 2016 to 2011 experience drought GRA failure pressure on urban areas food insecurity poverty degradation of environment and biodiversity second dharpur in Sudan illustrates linkage between poverty and environmental degradation and conflict like Bundelkhand in Madhya Pradesh communal conflict happened because of scarcity of resources and land ittirioration desertification shortage of rainfall drought in 1980 is in Northern darrpur sent its Nomadic population to migrates south in search of water and harding grounds brought them in conflict with local tribes

- Koshala lacked leadership vajji because of internal divisions within the threat to internal security Avanti could not leverage its position in the south

In this research paper I touch upon two themes Security second nationalism India's always had security challenges coming from the First the Harappan civilization was a victim of external invasion from the Northwest Disunity defeated porus when Alexander came till the gates of India Chandragupt and Ashoka United Dhol North block and those were never attack from Northwest or foiled many attacks Mauryan Empire later collapse because of neglect of Northwest Frontier not just this but also repeat the mistakes of vajji Avanti koshala lake of economy lack of leadership and being two centralised Gupta declined because of security challenges also social disorder lack of women polygamy etc Could enter India gain from Northwest because of locals disunity and lack of mutual cooperation. Delhi sultanate after which decline due to corruption stagnancy lack of economy and was attacked from the Northwest in the battle of Panipat when Babur entered India from shapscom value of Afghanistan and lead the foundation of Mughal Empire

The security aspect from the Northwest has remained the same irrespective of nationalism in India it was there before the Indian nation was formed and still prevail 75 years after its birth. India is famously called as the nation in making it was colonialism in India that give birth to nationalism in terms of the Indian independence movement

Moving away from the security challenge the early Mughals guarded the Western Frontier well but the problems emerged from within stagnancy of society dipping of economy the main aspect that remain was people remained divided on caste regional religious lines that tendency to live in closed net community the British could capture the subcontinent on the basis of advancement of Science and technology navy and engines British strategically superior and tactically sound minded through education they were the products of NSR information the industrial revolution that was experienced by the Britain and exploitation of internal fractures in the subcontinent by piting one cast against another and one religion against another these features and fractures that were present at that time still exist in spite of waves of nationalism throughout history

India has always been a land of migration internal and external leader with bhakti Sufi tradition since like Nanak Kabir mirabai in North bhakti saints in Maharashtra Namdev Eknath Tukaram Alwar South coexisted with Nizamuddin auliya of Delhi Khwaja Moinuddin Chishti of Ajmer and Baba Farid of Punjab it has had pluralistic characteristics symptoms of Identity markers cast class religion gender ethnicity the concept of nationalism in India has not been over around any of this identity markers but civic Republican by the constitution. We still are a prismatic society training into transitioning into a pan Indian identity change the fulcrum of nationalism is not any of the

identity markers of the past prevalent in the subcontinent the journey to Indian national becomes a little challenging with capitalism shrinkage of public spaces urbanization getaization globalisation and reassertion of our past identities make the job all the more difficult where the businesses are arranged on communal lines community live in society's which are caste based and marriages are done on the basis of caste these basic belief system runs contrary to the making of modern secular Indian identity

Other modern nation States around The World find it easy to identify with the nation as it's based on a language as in the case of Europe or religion as in the terms of Pakistan the task is difficult in our case as our nationalism does not find the parallel anywhere in the world show the task first is to completely break this shackles of Identity markers to be an Indian not only by definition but by spirit. With the challenges of wood Bank politics colonial by product capitalism inter mixed with caste religion hatred and dislike the base to conduct foreign policy by Indians remain narrow analytical weak. Public opinion on foreign policy issues remain uncooked and has very little understanding through these instances and stories and two pillars of security and nationalism the main theme of my research paper here is to showcase there is very little difference between domestic policy and foreign policy it is a reflection of what we do internally that radiates on the outside
